Customer Service Agent/Officer must verify the following Carriage Requirements are met:

1. The ON/OFF switch on all devices must be protected from turning on e.g. taped

Spare Batteries

1. The terminals must be individually protected from short circuiting e.g. taped, individual plastic bags, etc
2. No more than two spare batteries exceeding 100Wh but not exceeding 160Wh permitted per passenger.
